

Hurricanes Irma and María Timeline of Events in Puerto Rico





SEPTEMBER 2017

- 5: Hurricane Irma impacts Puerto Rico; Emergency Declaration issued for the island.
- 6: Major Disaster Declaration issued for Hurricane Irma.
- **18**: Emergency Declaration issued for Hurricane María.
- 20: Hurricane Maria makes landfall in Puerto Rico; Major Disaster Declaration issued.
- FEMA coordinates one of the largest, most complex federal disaster response missions in U.S. history.
- Focus is life-saving and life-sustaining, including shelter, medical assistance, food and water distribution.
- 27: Critical Needs Assistance approved.
- 28: 162 shelters open in Puerto Rico, with a population of 11,312.



OCTOBER

- 1: Emergency repair and reconstruction of critical infrastructure (medical facilities, roads, power, water, telecommunications, ports and airports) and debris removal are under way.
- 3: USNS Comfort hospital ship arrives in Puerto Rico.
- 9: First Individual Assistance funds disbursed.
- **19**: 16,500 federal, civilian and military personnel are deployed; Sheltering and Temporary Essential Power (*Tu Hogar Renace*) and Direct Lease programs approved.
- 28: 80 shelters open, with a population of 3,577.
- 30: Transitional Sheltering Assistance authorized to shelter displaced survivors at hotels.
- 31: Eight disaster recovery centers open.



NOVEMBER

- 3: FEMA begins local hiring.
- 16: Immediate Disaster Case Management approved.
- **19**: Individual Assistance registration deadline is extended.
- 20: USNS Comfort departs, having treated 1,899 patients, performed 191 surgeries, provided 76,000 liters of oxygen and 10 tons of food and water.
- 27: 27 disaster recovery centers open.
- 28: 42 shelters open, with a population of 1,135.
- 30: U.S. Army Corps of Engineers completes initial installation of requested generators.



DECEMBER

- 9: Combined federal assistance to Puerto Rico surpasses \$1 billion.
- 28: 27 shelters open, with a population of 428.
- 29: Individual Assistance surpasses \$825 million.
- 29: U.S. Small Business Administration approves more than \$271 million in loans.



JANUARY 2018

- 10: Voluntary Agencies Leading and Organizing Repair program begins.
- 24: SBA approves more than \$720 million in loans to homeowners, renters and businesses.
- 24: Individual Assistance surpasses \$993 million.
- 29: Shelter population declines to 168 in eight shelters.
- 30: 56 disaster recovery centers open.

FEBRUARY

- 1: FEMA Public Assistance obligates \$500 million for debris removal & emergency measures.
- 28: 10,700 survivors sheltering in hotels in 40 states and Puerto Rico under the Transitional Sheltering Assistance program.
- 28: USACE generator installations total 882 at critical sites.
- 28: Individual Assistance totals \$1 billion; SBA approves \$1.1 billion in disaster loans.
- 28: TSA extended until May 14; 65 disaster recovery centers open.



MARCH

- 15: Individual Assistance registration deadline extended to June 18.
- 22: More than 7,000 households receive support for hotel stays through TSA program
- 27: Last shelters close.
- 28: Individual Assistance totals \$1.17 billion; SBA approves \$1.3 billion in loans.
- 31: 63 disaster recovery centers open.



APRIL

- 18: Hurricane Season preparedness campaign begins.
- 20: FEMA Transitional Sheltering Assistance program extended.
- **30**: FEMA Public Assistance funding surpasses \$2 billion; Individual Assistance totals more than \$1.2 billion; SBA approves nearly \$1.5 billion in loans.
- 30: 64 disaster recovery centers open.



MAY

- 17-31: Hurricane preparedness exercises and training take place.
- 31: 64 disaster recovery centers open.
- 31: Individual Assistance totals \$1.3 billion; SBA loans total \$1.5 billion.



JUNE

- 1-26: Hurricane preparedness exercises and training continue.
- 18: Individual Assistance registration ends.
- 28: Individual Assistance totals \$1.35 billion: SBA loans total \$1.67 billion.
- 30: 60 disaster recovery centers open.
- 30: FEMA increases commodities stored in four new warehouses; 630 generators remain on island for potential use.



JULY

- 30: Individual Assistance totals \$1.38 billion; SBA disaster loans total \$1.7 billion.
- 31: 56 disaster recovery centers open.
- 31: FEMA Community Disaster Loans to municipalities surpass \$200 million.



AUGUST

• 7: Public Assistance program funding surpasses \$3 billion.



- SEPTEMBER

- 12: SBA loans total over \$1.855 billion.
- 12: Individual Assistance totals more than \$1.4 billion.
- 13: 80,877 homes repaired through the Tu Hogar Renace program, funded by FEMA.
- 13: 1,433 homes repaired through FEMA's VALOR program.
- 14: Transitional Sheltering Assistance ends.
